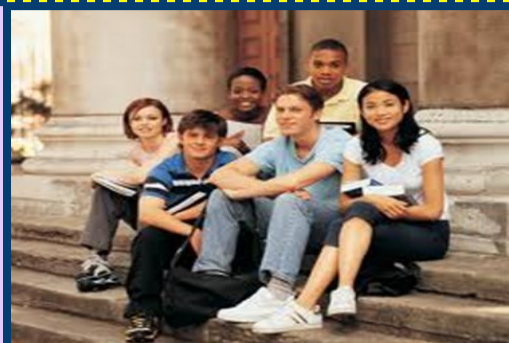

Military Child of the Year® Award

Now in its 17th year, Operation Homefront's Military Child of the Year® Award reflects the positive impact that these impressive young people have made on their military families, their schools, and their communities.

Submissions are OPEN for the esteemed Operation Homefront 2025 Military Child of the Year® Awards, the nation's premier recognition of the outstanding achievements of our military children. Submissions will close on December 2, 2024.

The annual awards recognize outstanding young people ages 13 to 18. Recipients will represent a branch of the armed forces — the Army, Marine Corps, Navy, Air Force, Coast Guard, National Guard, and Space Force — for their scholarship, volunteerism, leadership, extracurricular involvement, and other criteria while facing the challenges of military family life.

All Operation Homefront Military Child of the Year Award recipients will be flown with a parent or guardian to Washington, D.C., and recognized at the April 2025 gala, during which senior leaders of each branch of service will present the awards. They also will receive \$10,000 each, a laptop computer, and other donated gifts. The gala is usually held in April, the month of the military child, as a way to recognize the support and appreciation we provide to military families.

WHAT ARE THE ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS?

- Child must be a legal military dependent. Status confirmed by DEERS enrollment form.
- Military children must be between the ages of 13 and 18, at the time of nomination.
- Child and one adult guardian must be available to travel to the Washington, DC area April 8-11, during the month of the military child, for the Operation Homefront Military Child of the Year Awards Gala award presentation.
- Officers, directors, employees, and agents of Operation Homefront and its subsidiaries or affiliated organizations, and their immediate family members (parent, child, sibling, and spouse of each) and those living in the same households of each are not eligible to receive programs, services, grants, or donated goods intended for use by Operation Homefront's clients. Previous Operation Homefront Military Child of the Year Award Recipients, including Innovation Award recipients, are no longer eligible.

In addition to the above eligibility requirements, if selected as a Semifinalist, must:

- Provide Letters of recommendation
- Provide Form 1172- DEERS
- Be willing to participate in media and donor opportunities

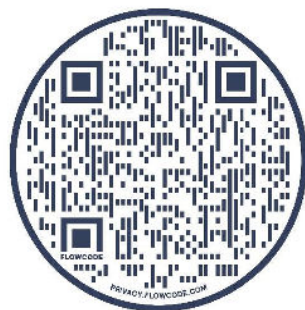

USC Bovard Scholars:

The USC Bovard Scholars program is a comprehensive initiative designed to assist academically accomplished high school students in navigating the college application journey. Selected scholars will benefit from the following components:

1. **College Application Support:** Our scholars will receive personalized guidance and support throughout their college application process, ensuring they are well-prepared for success.
2. **Financial Aid Assistance:** The program includes resources to help students understand and navigate the intricacies of financial aid, making higher education more accessible.
3. **Summer Residential Program:** Accepted scholars will have the unique opportunity to spend two weeks on USC's University Park campus during the summer, engaging in academic enrichment activities and gaining valuable insights into university life.

Criteria for Admission:

To be eligible for the USC Bovard Scholars program, applicants must meet the following criteria:

1. Be a current junior in high school and have a GPA of 3.7 or above
 2. Household income should reveal financial need, typically this is under \$100,000 per year

EARLY EDUCATION TEACHER DEVELOPMENT GRANT



PURPOSE OF THE GRANT:
To increase the number of highly qualified teachers available to serve in a California State Preschool Program (CSPP) and Transitional Kindergarten (TK) Programs, and to improve specific competencies of CSPP, TK, and Kindergarten teachers.

WHO CAN APPLY?

- Existing credentialed teachers
- Existing non-credentialed early childhood educators
- Paraeducators
- Extended day staff
- Others interested in a career in Early Childhood Education or Preschool through 3rd Grade.

AM I ELIGIBLE?
You may be eligible for the EETD Grant funding if the following applies to you:

- You have a career goal in early education (Preschool, TK, Kindergarten, 1st, 2nd, 3rd Grade)
- You work and/or live in Placer County

HOW MUCH FUNDING WILL I QUALIFY FOR?

- Up to \$4,300 per year for tuition toward a Bachelor's Degree, PK-3 ECE Specialist, or Multiple Subject Teaching Credential
- Up to \$1,000 per year toward Early Childhood Education Units and required courses for related majors
- Other financial costs, such as books, supplies, CTC fees, test fees, etc.

Online Learning Modules
The Clearinghouse for Military Family Readiness at Penn State is developing four online learning modules. The first module, which is about the Interstate Compact on Educational Opportunity for Military Children, will be debuted as part of the website launch. Three additional modules are currently in development. These modules will focus on military work-related parental absence, geographic transitions, and military and schools.




Toolkit
Each module contains a variety of resources including quick reference fact sheets, brochures, tip and strategy handouts, checklists, and links to outside handouts and resources. The Toolkit resources are directly related to the online learning modules.




Top Resources
The Clearinghouse vetted over 250 free, publicly-available resources related to school personnel and military children. The best resources related to each of the following will be highlighted on the website: academics, behavior, deployment or parental absence, grief, parental injury, the Interstate Compact, military children, military culture, and reintegration.



Clearinghouse Continuum of Evidence
The Clearinghouse for Military Family Readiness at Penn State has reviewed over 1000 programs to determine the potential benefit to military families. To view the effectiveness of a particular program, or identify reviewed programs, users can click on the link to the Continuum from the School Resources page.




Technical Assistance
The Clearinghouse also provides assistance with program selection, implementation, and evaluation via Technical Assistance (TA). Specialists are available to support you in your work with military families.




Funded by the Office of Military Community and Family Policy, the TA Specialists at the Clearinghouse are available, free of charge, to consult with you as you think about the best ways to work with Military families. The Clearinghouse TA staff can support you by:

- Identifying data and research findings related to evidenced-based programs and implementation science
- Providing information on evidence-based programs
- Assisting with selecting a program
- Providing strategies to help with program implementation
- Obtaining program or training materials
- Developing a program evaluation plan
